01. Around the Louvre museum

Starting from the Louvre, the largest museum in the world, you will be able to discover this wonderful historic district as you pass through the Tuileries gardens on your journey to the Comédie-Française.



02. Around the Eiffel Tower

Built for the 1889 Universal Exhibition and originally named the "300-meter tower", the Eiffel Tower has become the symbol of the French capital... and an architectural phenomenon!



03. Around the Sacré-Cœur

Welcome to Montmartre, the famous hill topped by the Basilica of Sacré-Cœur. The Paris Commune took place in Montmartre in 1871 before it became a popular district for artists during the 19th and 20th centuries.



04. Around the Pompidou Centre

This museum houses Europe's greatest collection of modern art. You will see the museum as you stroll towards the historic center of Le Marais. You might also catch a glimpse of many colorful characters along the way!



05. Around La Villette and Pantin

The Cité des sciences et de l'industrie has pride of place in the Parc de La Villette. The Park itself is crossed by the Ourcq canal and is home to many gardens, street art frescoes and cultural spaces.



06. Saint-Denis

Near the Stade de France® you can admire the former royal abbey of Saint-Denis, which was one of the places where the Kings and Queens of France were crowned. This adventure offers the perfect balance between modernity and history.



07. Vincennes

The Château de Vincennes protected the capital city for a very long time. After strolling along the pathways of Vincennes' famous wood and the streets of the town center, discover this fortress which was also used as a prison.



08. Vitry-sur-Seine

Now you're in Vitry-sur Seine! Here you will find many amazing attractions such as the MAC VAL art museum, the Exploradôme, the town hall as well as many street art frescoes...



09. Boulogne-Billancourt

Welcome to Boulogne-Billancourt! Just a stone's throw from the capital, this area has something for everyone: from the modern Seine musicale concert hall to the serres d'Auteuil (Auteuil greenhouses) and the famous 1930s buildings.



10. Sceaux

Discover the estate previously owned by Colbert where you can admire his château, the huge canal, the French garden and the orangery. Not far from there you can also explore the Home of Chateaubriand and the Arboretum of the Vallée-aux-Loups...



11. Meaux

Explore the ramparts of Meaux and admire the treasures of this medieval town. There are also many different museums to discover such as the Great War Museum (1914-1918) which is just a short walk from the site of the famous Battle of the Marne.



12. Fontainebleau

Much loved by Francis I, the Palace of Fontainebleau was the artistic heart of the Renaissance. Don't forget to visit the forest, stroll through its gardens and wander through the charming streets of the town.



13. Provins

The medieval town of Provins was once the capital of the Counts of Champagne. It is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The knights and birds of prey displays will take you back to the Middle Ages!



14. Versailles

Welcome to the home of the Sun King! The Palace and its gardens are true symbols of the absolute monarchy. In addition to the Palace, you can admire the Great Stables and discover the Salle du Jeu-de-Paume, the theater of the French Revolution.



15. Saint-Germain-en-Laye

The national estate of Saint-Germain-en-Laye contains a large collection of antique objects from all over the world. The city has a long history, which you will discover on your adventure.



16. Rambouillet

Combining art, history and nature, this journey will take you to the must-visit sites of the former royal town of Rambouillet. Visit its château, its park, its forest and its many fantastic museums.



17. Dourdan

The Château de Dourdan was used as a vacation home, then as a hunting lodge and finally as a horrible prison! Learn more about the history of the town's ramparts, its market hall and its church.



18. Milly-la-Forêt

Previously a seigneurial estate, the village of Milly-la-Forêt is now the site of Jean Cocteau's house, "Le Cyclop" (a statue created by Jean Tinguely), a dovecote, a 15th-century market hall and several ancient washhouses.



19. Auvers-sur-Oise

This commune was the meeting place of the greatest artists and painters of their time, such as Van Gogh, Daubigny and other impressionist artists. Even today, this town inspires the most creative minds.



20. La Roche-Guyon

La Roche-Guyon is one of the most beautiful villages in France. Its château, its medieval keep and its vegetable garden, located on the right bank of the river Seine, make this unique place even more charming.



21. Poissy

Poissy is one of the oldest royal cities in Île-de-France! The renowned architect Le Corbusier and the painter Ernest Meissonier are among the personalities you'll meet who have marked the history of the place.



22. Chevreuse

With the medieval Château de la Madeleine sitting atop its side, the town of Chevreuse offers a bucolic setting with plenty of opportunities to do sport. From the historic center to the banks of the Yvette, get set for an adventure!



23. La Défense

Behind its glass offices and tall towers, the largest business district in Europe hides many treasures... Let yourself be surprised by an open-air art collection!



24. The curves of the Marne

On this adventure, enjoy a walk along the water, equal parts nature and heritage. Your journey will take you to the banks of the Marne to discover places steeped in history.



25. Coulommiers

Known for its cheese, Coulommiers will also surprise you with its fascinating history. Set out to discover the city's unmissable monuments and buildings and travel through the ages with your family!



26. Melun

Occupied since Gallic times, Melun offers a verdant setting on the banks of the Seine. From the botanical garden to the Place Saint-Jean, with a stop at the Musée de la gendarmerie nationale along the way, there are plenty of discoveries to be made.



27. Corbeil-Essonnes

Find treasures from the past scattered around the city! Contemplate the cathedral, find out who Count Haymon was and retrace the history of Corbeil-Essonnes from prehistoric times...



28. Saint-Ouen

Welcome to Saint-Ouen, famous for its flea markets. With their unique atmosphere, these famous markets are a place for antique dealers, second-hand dealers and designers to come together.



29. Luzarches

When was the Halle de Luzarches built? And the town hall? What was the Porte Saint-Côme used for? Find out during your adventure in the heart of this thriving medieval city!



30. Rueil-Malmaison

Explore Rueil-Malmaison and travel back in time to discover the First and Second Empire! From the local History museum to the château de Malmaison, uncover the secrets of the imperial city.
